The College of New Jersey

- □ The College (TCNJ)
 - State college, located in Ewing, NJ
 - Primarily undergraduate institution
 - Approximately 6,000 FTE
- □ The Library
 - Over 600,000 volumes in general collection
 - Video holdings: 12,500 unique titles (15,000 videos)
 - Videos arranged by accession number in closed stacks
 - Video cataloging staff: ½ FTE with help from cataloging/metadata librarian

Challenges of Video Collections

- Substantial uncataloged video materials not accessible via online catalog
 - "56% of all libraries report having backlogs that are increasing in size, with videos and DVDs being the most problematic ..." *
- OPACs have not done a good job of providing browsing access to video materials. **

Video Cataloging at TCNJ

- □ Before 2004, preliminary cataloging records were manually created for all newly arrived videos
- Before 2009, all videos needed to be viewed for cataloging
- □ As of July 2004, over 2,200 videos were in the backlogs (over 3 years of acquisitions)



New Preliminary Cataloging Procedures



Preliminary Cataloging (Pre-cat) Workflow

- Legacy practice
 - Manually created preliminary cataloging records
 - Information mostly taken from container including title, play time, summary, etc.
 - Entered by student workers
 - Fulfilled circulation needs
- Drawback
 - Time consuming
 - Typos easily made
 - Limited information for discovery



New Procedures Implemented

- Use OCLC records instead
 - Trained Media Services staff to search and identify best records on OCLC
 - Established routine workflow for exporting/importing records
 - OCLC records also imported to retrospectively replace existing manual pre-cat records
 - Pre-Cat records later fully examined and cataloged by the professional video cataloger

New Workflow Benefits

- □ Time efficient
 - No manual typing, less errors
- □ Videos more discoverable
 - Enriched descriptive information
 - More access points (casts, production team, etc.)
 - Subjects and genre are also available
- □ Fulfill circulation purposes

Revising Copy Cataloging Procedures



Previous Cataloging Practice

- □ Viewed every single video and checked the chief source and credits
- Checked description, performed authority work, and added genre terms and MARC relator codes in 700 fields
- Mostly copy cataloging

Assessing the practice

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- □ Impractical, time-consuming
- □ Backlogs accumulated quickly
- □ Full level OCLC copy basically trustworthy
- □ Created duplication of effort
- □ Against shared cataloging principles

Question:

Viewing videos for full level copy necessary?

Simplifying Video Copy Cataloging

- 1) Implemented in late 2008
- 2) Container cataloging for full level copy records
- 3) Accept descriptions except for obvious typos
- 4) Continue to perform authority work
- 5) View videos only when needed

New Cataloging Practice – Outcomes

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- Cataloging productivity nearly doubled
- Cataloging backlogs reduced from 2,000 to 500 videos within a year, completely eliminated within another half year
- □ Pre-cat practice discountinued

Video Genre/Form Heading Project



Needs for User Access by Genre

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- Users want to find videos by category (e.g., comedy films, war films)
- Public browsing not possible with current arrangement (closed stacks, arranged by accession number)

Previous Practice -- Genre/Form Terms

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- □ LC genre terms added to new records since 2007
- □ Split files in catalog partial access and retrieval

Needed to have video categories comprehensively represented in the catalog

Project Procedures

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- □ A list of all video records with existing 650 fields generated (11,635 records)
- Examined and evaluated genre headings used in 650 field
- Established workflows for three categories
 - Records with LC genre terms in 650 fields
 - Records with migfg headings in 655 fields
 - Records with no genre terms found
- □ Prepared two lists of genre terms for conversion

Clean-up Workflows


- Records with LC genre terms in 650 fields
 - Re-tag to 655 fields
 - 650 _0 Comedy films. → 655 _0 Comedy films.
- Records with Moving Image Genre-Form Guide headings in 655 fields
 - Convert to LCGFT equivalents
 - 655_7 Comedy. \$2 migfg \rightarrow 655_0 Comedy films. Or 655_0 Television comedies.
- 3) Records with no genre terms found
 - Find genre information from IMDb (Internet Movie Database) and assign appropriate LC genre terms


Project Team

- □ Two copy catalogers
 - Each assigned 3,500 older video records
 - Worked on fiction films and television programs
- AV Cataloger and Cataloging/Metadata Librarian
 - Worked on non-fiction videos
 - Performed initial review of enhanced records by copy catalogers
 - Monitored project progress
- □ Timeline: December 2009 August 2010

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Today I was looking for a DVD or two to check out. I started with a simple keyword search on "noir" which has always been hit-or-miss in the past.

But then I saw the "Film noir" genre heading and was delighted to see that we have 60 videos under this heading. Very cool!!

One of the films that comes up under this genre heading is "Sunset Blvd."

This was released in 1950, and we have a 2002 Special Collector's Edition DVD.

"Sunset Blvd" is certainly a classic film noir. However, a keyword search on film noir would not have brought it up without the addition of the genre heading.

I guess this is how discovery tools are supposed to work. I think I get it now!

4 Enhancing Access to Foreign Language Videos



Using Foreign Language Films

- □ Educational purpose
 - Modern Languages Dept.
 - Other departments (Cinematography classes, etc.)
- □ Leisure purpose
 - Native speaker

Finding Foreign Films - General Practice

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- Using OPAC Advanced Search interface
 - Multiple steps needed to limit searches
 - □ Complicated, not intuitive
 - Seldom used
- □ Separate interface for video access
 - Not integrated into catalog, separate database might not be in sync with catalog and needs update
- □ Separate lists of foreign language films
 - Not integrated into OPAC, need regular updates

Needs for Easy Access to Foreign Films

- "Users desired a way to retrieve foreign films as a distinct category" *
- "It's important to perform "natural language" searches for films in a particular language or from a particular country" *
- □ Locally, frequently requested by TCNJ users

Implementing Local Practice

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
- To add local language genre terms to all records of non-English language videos
- Several options were assessed and decision made to add:


655 _7 \$a Spanish films. \$2 local


- Performance-related videos (e.g., operas, concerts, ballet) were excluded
- □ Tentatively left out the "nationality" aspect


Project Procedures


- Extracted records of non-English videos from local Voyager system
- □ Separated into two categories
 - Performance videos
 - Non-English films (a total of 1,923 records)
- □ Batch added local 655s to appropriate and applicable records using MarcEdit
- □ Project period: Oct. 2011-Jan. 2012














What's Next
