



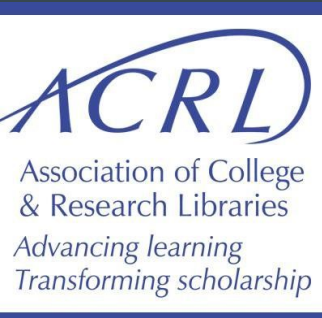

- Established by the Society of Jesus as a college in 1960
- Became a full University in 1970
- Consists of 9 college and 12 graduate school

- Two libraries (Loyola Library and Law Library)

- Around 23 billion won (2.3 million US dollar)



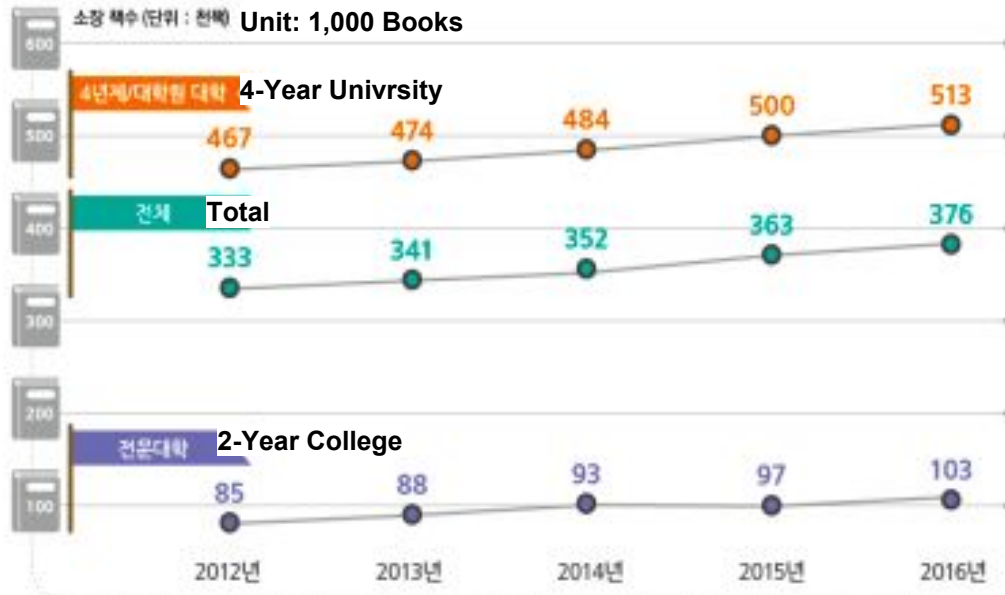

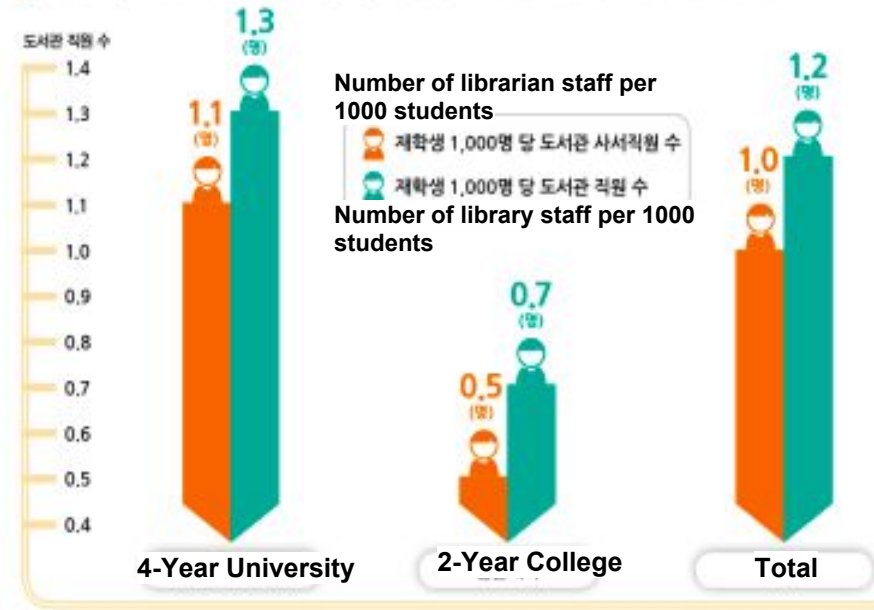

1. Statistics & Qualifications

- Three categories of librarian Licences
 - First-grade professional librarian
 - Second-grade professional librarian
 - Paraprofessional librarian

Most university librarians holds First or Second-grade librarian licenses.
But **acquiring MLIS is not required.**

- Grades are determined by education. A university or college degree is required, but completion of a library academy would also be acceptable.
- There are a total 86,404 librarian licenses issued as of October 31, 2016. (2,421 for First-grade professional, 52,107 for Second-grade professional, 31,876 for Paraprofessional)

budget for E-Resources: %



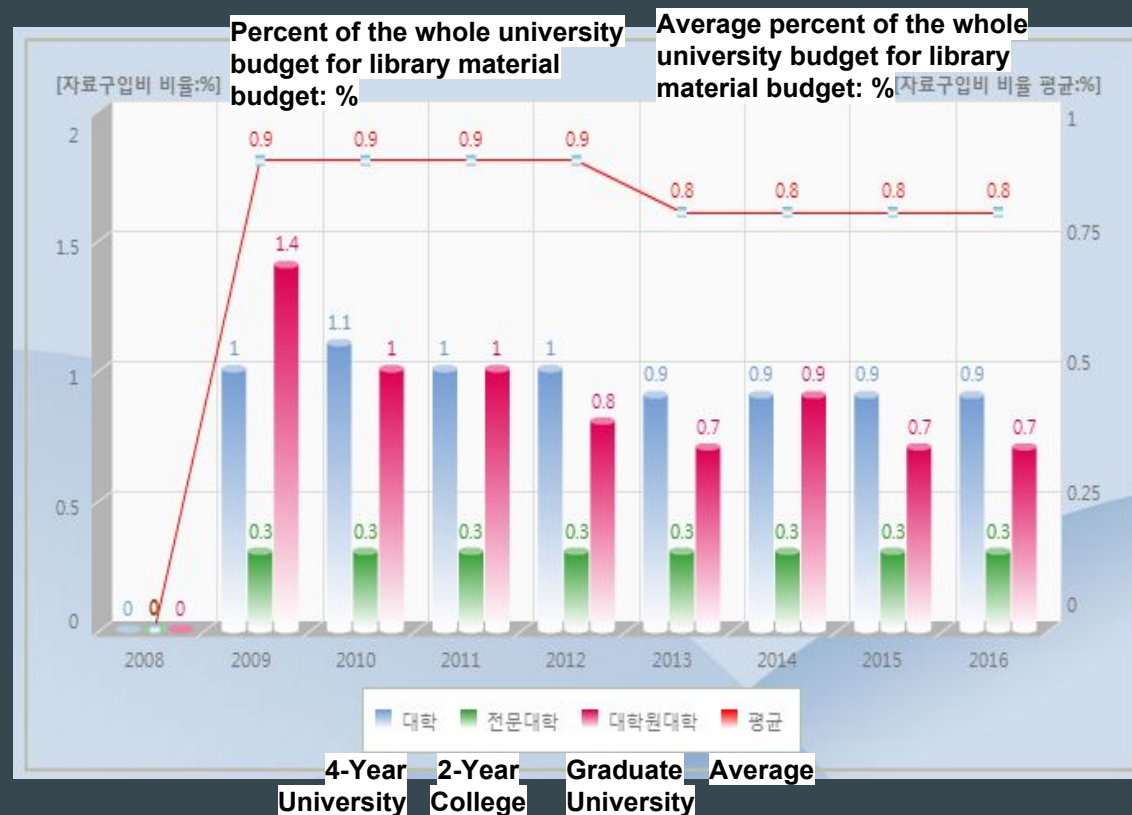

Issues 1. E-Resources Subscription

“From now on, Korea should also carefully review the academic information circulation system and turn it into the most desirable direction at the national level and establish a strategy so that it will not be absorbed into academic information in developed countries(곽동철, 2016).”

- **Background**

- Reduction of the library material budget and increasing subscription cost
- Unpredictable of exchange-rate fluctuation and KRW depreciation (Need to pay each country's currency)
- The proliferation of national-led consortiums : ACE, KESLI

- **Result**

- Caused some consortium items to be broken down, subscription termination
- Provided inefficient academic resources as a package which is not even used.

Issues 2. School administration attitude towards librarians

“It is common that Librarians at Private University move to administrative offices(김지홍, 2011).”

- **Reason**

- Lack of budget by tuition freeze and decrease of students → Reduce employees → Send librarians to administrative offices
- Lack of understanding librarians' specialties → Send young and competent librarians to main administrative offices

- **Problem**

“Academic librarians are 1,255 less than 10 years ago. Lots of Universities send librarians to other administrative offices, and send temporary librarians or even part-time job students to libraries(백수현, 2014).”

- Poor library service or management can be caused by staffing problem

Issues 3. Enact “The Academic Library Promotion Act”

“University librarians responded that big issues related to the university library is the Academic Library Promotion Act(노영희, 2016).”

- **Background**

- “The Library Act” focuses on public libraries and the National library

- **Contents**

- Covered of the obligation, management, work, personnel, a committee for library management, facilities and resources, promotion plan for academic library assessment, etc.

- **After the enactment**

- Enacted “Enforcement ordinance of the Academic Library Promotion Act”
- Started to change school regulations to reflect the Act
- With minimum limit guidance, some are worried of academic libraries are being worse

RISS & FRIC

RISS (Research Information Sharing Service) <http://www.riss.kr>

- An academic research information service operated by Korea Education & Research Information Service (KERIS) which is a department of education funded since 1998
- Provides various academic information such as domestic journals, overseas journals, monographs as well as theses
- Number of Theses: about 1,960,464
- Since 2007, KERIS has been distributing a system called dCollection to universities nationwide.
- Theses registered through dCollection will be transferred to RISS within the scope of the original text agreement.

FRIC (Foreign Research Information Center) <http://www.fric.kr>

- Support small and medium university libraries and researchers who are unable to meet the demand for expensive foreign academic information
- The university selected as a support center for foreign academic journals provides the original journals in its own journals for the students of other institutions as well as the researchers of other institutions.
(50% of the journal subscription fee is supported by the government and supported investment budget)

Research Service: North Korean Studies

- **North Korean Studies in Sogang University**
 - North Korea Politics in the Department of Political Science, Graduate School
 - Department of North Korea Studies and Unification Policy, Graduate School of Public Policy
- **General services for North Korean Studies**
 - Acquisition, Cataloging, Circulation, Interlibrary Loan, Document Delivery, etc.

Research Service: North Korean Studies

- **Provide materials published in North Korea**

- Closed Materials(특수자료)

Materials which contains below

- a. Political or ideological materials published by North Korea or anti-government organization
 - b. Content is to propagate North Korea or anti-government organization
 - c. Content is to propagate Communism
 - d. Content is to deny the legitimacy of South Korea or liberal democracy

- Permission to be a Closed Materials Institution(특수자료 취급기관)

Institutions can only apply with below purposes

- a. To study and research
 - b. Agencies where need to import or offer materials for other Closed Materials Institutions
 - c. Institutions where need to handle Closed Materials for work

Regulated by the Ministry of Education & Human Resources Development

Research Service: North Korean Studies

- **Closed Materials Service in Sogang University**

- **Resources: 1,978 books** (as of Dec. 2016)
 - a. Books: 1,508 books
 - b. Paper journals: 1 title(Rodong Sinmun), 468 books
- **User Service**
 - a. Reading: can read in the designated place after checking the identification
 - b. Borrowing: can borrow during 30 days after checking the identification and writing the oath
 - ※ Only 3 people read 10 books and 1 person borrowed 1 book in 2016
- **Report to the Government**
 - a. Annual report about the status of use and collection
 - b. Regular report to check the process of the service and the facility followed by the manual
