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

Technical services in transition

- Technical services are centralized in Collections, Access, and Discovery
- Special Collections technical services and non-Special Collections technical services are integrated
- Centralization rather than microcosm

Acquisitions & Discovery

- Resource Acquisition & Description
- Metadata Creation & Organization
- Metadata Analysis & Design

Resource Acquisition and Description

- Order, receive, link to existing metadata, and pay for materials for library collections in all necessary formats

Metadata Creation and Organization

- Arrange and describe materials in all formats for which adequate description cannot be provided by other sources



Metadata Analysis and Design

- Set policies and guidelines for metadata standards and repositories to facilitate discovery and distribution

You can never not do
analysis; you never know

Education and cross-training

- Focus on function
- Integrating specialist skills and generalist skills for more holistic approach to metadata creation and management

Confronting backlogs

- Legacy finding aids
 - Paper finding aids
 - Finding aids in obsolete formats

Powering a universe of metadata activity

- Expanding metadata services throughout the Library and University
- Pan-University teams focused on metadata interactions with content and systems
- Metadata consultations and content management
