The ACRL Chapters Council undertook a survey of local chapters members in order to "gauge the membership's satisfaction with the current funding situation for the chapters. The goal of the survey was to tap into the membership and, through their feedback and suggestions, provide ACRL National and ACRL Chapters Council with other options for funding, perhaps even replacing the current situation of national funding regional chapters based on per member basis." The survey was completed and presented at the Annual Conference. The Council is continuing to review and discuss options for recommending changes in the funding practices.

4. Develop and deliver responsive professional development programs that build the skills and capacity for leadership and local data-informed and evidence-based advocacy.

The Chapter Council Survey Results have led to a discussion on the possibility of requesting access to webinars and/or other digital training opportunities from ACRL to support the local chapters.
