

## **2018-10-18 SustainRT Board Conference Call**

### **Committee Reports:**

- **Programming** (Meredith)
- **Governance** (Rene Tanner) - the committee needs more members. Suggested to send a note on the listserv to get some student members to join as committee members. Rene mentioned that her university's president is putting money towards staff travel to make it green/purchasing carbon offprints. Rene and Rebekkah Smith Aldrich of the Sustainable Task Force are working to set up a meeting with Mary, working on a draft outline of the recommendations from the Task Force report. A suggestion was made to perhaps host a discussion group at ALA Annual around the SustainRT task force document.
- **Online Education** (Eric Tans)
- **Book Award** (Susan Conlon) - has met once, and is in process of setting up another meeting. Working on a book list for their next meeting. Susan asked about the protocol to look for funding for the committee. At their first meeting, the committee:
  - Looked at scope of award, looking at current awards out there for a good model on how to frame the book award
  - Looking into sponsorship possibility to fund award?
  - Naming opportunity for the award by sponsor possibly>

- Working on developing a timeline and eligibility criteria, with the goal of a list of recommended titles in Spring 2019.

Uta asked about the possibility of giving a non monetary award, given our values as an organization to try something more sustainable for the long term of award.

- **Outreach** (Carol Sevin) - in the process of setting up a monthly committee meeting
- **Membership** (Madeline Charney) - membership well over 900 members now, with more than half of them student memberships which are free. She was looking into a pilot mentoring/buddy system to get student members more involved. Some suggestions to involve students included:
  - Blog posts
  - Book award suggestions
  - Environmental scan assistance
  - Hosting online conversations.

Membership committee is also looking into a fundraiser of a sustainable item to purchase, such as a spork. Could it be sold on our website?

## **Old Business**

Beth is still working on the environmental scan - cleaning up the data and working on a platform to share results. Could the SustainRT website host this?

Lessa shared some updates from ALA:

- Reach out when we have staffing changes on committees or Board
- The ALA executive board is meeting next week in Chicago, looking at ways to make ALA more effective in the 21st century
- The meeting room policy is being revised and is back out for comments

**New Business:**

Who will be attending ALA Midwinter in Seattle? Rene, Uta, Amy, Susan, and Lisa indicated they were planning to attend. Amy shared our schedule for the conference thus far:
