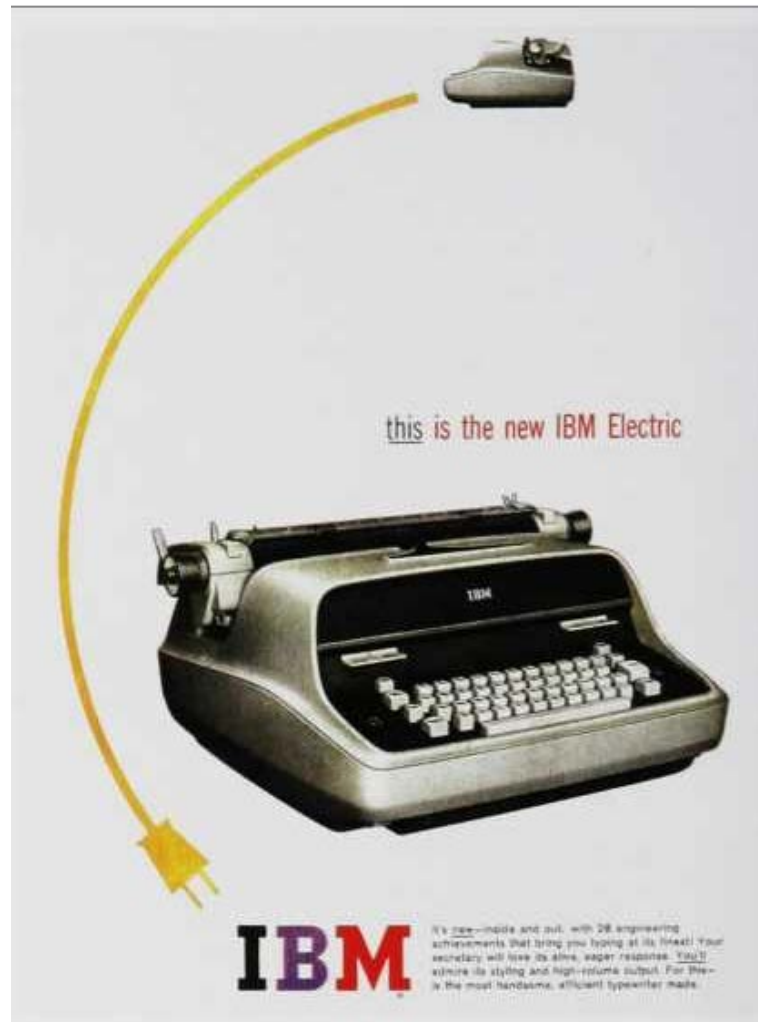

THE SHARE-VDE PROJECT

A prototype of a virtual discovery environment with a three BIBFRAME layer architecture (Person/Work, Instance, Item) has been established through the individual processes of analysis, entity identification and reconciliation, conversion and publication of data from MARC21 to RDF, within the context of libraries with different systems, habits and cataloguing traditions. In order to test the SHARE-VDE platform on a critical mass of heterogeneous data embracing a significant number of cases that come from different stages of the libraries' catalogues, the collections from the below listed participant libraries, with imprint years 1985 and 2015, were included. Phase 1 includes 2,308,204 bibliographical records and 3,601,327 authority records. A number of further activities and the processing for the enrichment and the conversion of approximately 100 million of catalogue records are foreseen during phase 2 of the project.
