Primary users of images

- Faculty and students
 - Art and Art History
 - Architecture
- Images used for teaching and research by faculty
- Students use images in assignments and research

Department of Art History

- Visual Resources Curator
- Some 100,000+ images in Imagebase (Embark)
- Rich metadata exists for these images; use of VRA Core
- Scans images on demand; some redundancy in scanning
- One assistant to help with scanning

Architecture

- Architecture Librarian in Architecture Library
- Analog slide collection in library is rarely used
- Images used for teaching were scanned long ago
- Faculty use ARTstor to look for images
- Students can use Digital Media Lab in Library to scan images for class projects, etc.

However ...

- Technology makes it easier and faster for faculty to capture and store digital images – less paperwork/hassle
- Faculty members now have means to create personal digital collections
- Users first search Google/Flickr for images and then consult LibGuide to find online image resources, other than ARTstor

New users of images

- Political cartoons of the Vietnam War by particular cartoonist
- Populism in Latin America – images of Evita Peron – research by faculty member in Modern Languages
- History of pisco (wine) production and marketing in Peru and Chile – Department of History
- Visual resources needed for research on health care reforms in the US in the 20th century – International Studies department

Workshops conducted by librarians

- Using ARTstor
 - Register for an ARTstor account
 - Search for images
 - Create image groups
 - Download image (groups) to PowerPoint

Workshops (contd.)

- Using Flickr
 - Setting up an account
 - Uploading photographs
 - Using Flickr Commons

Workshops (contd.)

- Librarians direct patrons to various online images resources:
 - NYPL digital library
 - Library of Congress
 - Smithsonian

Visual Resources Working Group

- Participation in development of ARTstor's Shared Shelf platform
- Shared Shelf to enable campus faculty and departments to build, manage, access and share visual content across the University of Miami campus and other associated campuses.

Visual Resources Program ...

- Identify current use of visual resources
- Explore services necessary to support and enhance teaching, learning, and research at UM
- Currently use of visual resources in teaching is being managed through a number of areas

Goal of Visual Resources Program ...

- to gather information and identify possible ways to combine and/or develop services, inform faculty, and create a useful collaborative visual resources program

VR Group tasks

- Identify current and future stakeholders, departmental collaborations
- Develop and implement needs assessment
- Develop a survey and interview faculty and students at UM to determine the needs across discipline

VR Group tasks ...

- Develop organizational and budgetary models to support VR program – includes staffing, skills and training
- Compile findings and data and make recommendations for future directions
