Conferences and Events:

1) AAS/CEAL 2018 annual meeting was held during March 19-25 at the Marriott Wardman Park Hotel in Washington, DC. This exciting annual conference attracted more than 3,800 attendees and featured 447 sessions and a book exhibition.

Highlighted below are programs that pertain to the East Asian Technical Services in particular:

- 2018 CEAL Cataloging Workshop, organized by CEAL Committee on Technical Processing (CTP)
 - Kate James (LC) provided status report on RDA 3R project;
 - Jessalyn Zoom (LC) presented the NACO updates since last CEAL workshop;
 - Shi Deng (UC San Diego) led discussion about Best Practices in CJK NACO and CJK Pseudonyms;
 - Lia Contursi (Columbia Law) and Charlene Chou (U Washington) on behalf of SAC Subcommittee on Faceted Vocabularies led the discussion about CJK demographic and genre terms;
 - Keiko Suzuki (New School) and Charlene Chou (U Washington) on behalf of Numeral Subgroup of Japanese Romanization Working Group led discussion about CJK Numerals;
 - Bie-Hwa Ma (UCSD) and Charlene Chou (U Washington) provided reports on ERMB Cooperative Cataloging Project for e-Resources and CJK CONSER Funnel Project

- 2018 CEAL ERMB Workshop, organized by the Task Force on Metadata Standards and Best Practices for East Asian Electronic Resources (ERMB)
 - Nettie Lagace, the Associate Director for Programs from the NISO-national Information Standards Organization made presentation and also led discussion about the general reasons why we need to establish NISO standards as well as the benefits of compliance and the consequences of not complying with specific standards. This workshop also clarified that as users increasingly utilize e-resources, the responsibilities of vendors/publishers and librarians in all service areas have been more or less impacted.

- Nettie also introduced the recently-developed recommended practice, NISO RP-25-2016, Outputs of the NISO Alternative Assessment Metrics (Altmetrics) Project and the essential tools to improve user discovery and access to e-resources.
- During the CTP Special Session, there was a panel discussion focusing on the LC BIBFRAME Updates: Pilot 2 for Non-Roman Scripts. This panel session was a response to many CEAL colleagues' interests and concerns about the impact of LC BIBFRAME (as a replacement for MARC) on CJK resources. Three BIBFRAME testers from LC were invited to provide attendees with the status report, including the perspectives of PCC, MARC standards and catalogers.

- OCLC May 22, 2018 [PCCLIST] 260 to 264 field conversion in RDA bibliographic records in WorldCat
