What's gender anyway?

- **Socially constructed**

We make our ideas about gender and sexuality together.

- **Contingent**

We understand gender and sexuality relationally.

- **Contested and negotiated**

We struggle with and against each other about the meaning of gender and sexuality.

- **Social and public**

We name ourselves to find each other.

RDA 9.7

9.7.1.3 Recording Gender

Record the gender of the person using an appropriate term from the following list:

female

male

not known

RDA 9.7.1.3 cont.

If none of the terms listed is appropriate or sufficiently specific, record an appropriate term or phrase.

EXAMPLE

intersex

transsexual woman

Gender, RDA style

- literally embodied
 - easily defined
 - visually identified
 - female, male, or empty data
 - fixed, now and forever
-
- **But this has real-world ramifications**

Fixed and linear.

Name heading: Bono, Chaz

Gender: female (1969-2008?)

Gender: male (2008?-present)

Variant: Bono, Chastity



Miss-identification

Name heading: Big Freedia

Gender: female

Variant: Fredia, Big

Variant: Ross, Freddie



Just plain rude

Name heading: Bornstein, Kate, 1948-

Gender: transgender

Information found: born March 15, 1948, in Neptune, NJ as Albert Herman Bornstein; underwent sex-reassignment surgeries from 1985-1986



Kermit the (male) Frog



Caitlyn Jenner



We need a third option

- FastTrack Proposal submitted to JSC to add “transgender” as an official term to the RDA vocabularies
 - Accepted “umbrella term” for the trans* community
 - Promotes controlled vocabularies and collocation
- The proposal was deferred and the broader issue will be discussed at the JSC Nov. 2015 meeting

We need oversight


- Form a NACO funnel group to handle NAFs for trans* individuals

We need research

Little big wins

- LC will be removing outdated training videos and updating other training materials at some point soon after ALA.
- LC/PCC has no policy for providing the element, this is left to cataloger judgment. The old maxim “if in doubt, leave it out” is sound advice.
- As always, NACO members encountering incorrect information in authority records, including the 375 field, are encouraged to **correct the information**.
