SEEKING DIRECTION

Seeking Direction: the Survey

- How you use FAST
- Evaluation of current services
- Interest in new services:
 - Batch conversions
 - Integration into cataloging
 - Updates to WorldCat records
 - Ability to request new headings

Seeking Direction: the Interviews

- January – March 2018
- 10 institutions:
 - British Library
 - Brown
 - Columbia
 - Cornell
 - Harvard
 - Penn State
 - Stanford
 - Yale
 - Analysis & Policy Observatory
 - Royal Melbourne Institute of Technology

Seeking Direction: the Conversations

- Reviewing the findings and each others' perspectives
- Discuss options for the future
- Determine initial next steps

WHAT WE DISCOVERED

Primary Needs and Concerns (1)

- FAST supported long-term
- Must continue to be easy to use
- Retain same tools (improve some)
- Add batch conversion, APIs (and integrate)
- Regular updates

Primary Needs and Concerns (2)

- Continued access, preferably open
- Clear development path
- Add guidance on use
- Clearly defined relationship with LCSH
- Better content and coverage

Why New Terms?

- Terms not accepted by SACO
- Terms specific to domains
- Terms specific to formats
- Time periods appropriate to other cultures

Why Alternative Terms?

- Offensive terms (“Illegal Aliens”)
- Equivalent across cultures:
 - Australian term: Public Service
 - UK term: Civil Service
 - US term: Public Administration
- American spelling and phrases (“health and hygiene”)
- Public discussion

Relationship to LCSH

- As primary source
- For new and alternative terms:
 - Track provenance
 - Track cultural applicability?
 - Link relationships to existing terms

Better Content & Coverage

Options:

- 1) Submit proposals to SACO
- 2) Community provides new terminology

OR ...

Incorporate Other Vocab: Pros

- Leverage expertise and contributions of others
- Avoid recreating the wheel
- Broader, deeper coverage

Incorporate Other Vocabas: Cons

- Overhead and maintenance
- Loss of incoming vocabulary structure
- Makes FAST too complex and difficult to use

Alternative Terms & Languages

- Multiple cultural options per language
- Multiple languages

WHAT'S NEXT

Potential Future Goals

- Coalesce multiple name/identity sources
- Ability to select sources
- Multi-lingual, multi-script
- Map to other vocabularies
- One-stop shop for multiple vocabularies?

Community Involvement

- Suggest new terminology
- Vote on terms
- Working groups:
 - Assess other controlled vocabularies
 - Determine viability of mappings
 - Documentation
 - Term definitions, scope, and guidelines
 - Training resources

Guidance and Engagement

Editorial Policy Committee:

- Oversees community engagement
- Establish editorial policies and principles
- Recommends strategic directions and improvements
- Sets priorities
- Advocates for FAST
- Facilitates dissemination of training resources

Develop editorial policy committee:

- Scope of work
- Structure
- Requirements for participation
- Selection
- Length of terms
