In this 60-minute presentation, Mark Aaron Polger will discuss some of the best practices when designing effective library signage. He will outline the steps in conducting a signage audit, and how to use different signage research techniques to obtain valuable qualitative and quantitative data from your users. Mark will describe how to compose a succinct message and provide advice when planning and designing a library signage system. He will conclude by providing guidelines on mounting and placement of signage, and ADA requirements. This webinar will be highly interactive and practical, as Mark will also discuss how to craft a library signage policy document. Lastly, he will address the technical specifications needed for a digital signage system in your library.

Mark Aaron Polger is Associate Professor/Coordinator of Library Outreach at the College of Staten Island, City University of New York (CUNY). His responsibilities include promoting library services and resources and teaching the information literacy course (Beyond Google) in the department. Polger's research interests include library marketing, outreach, and user experience (UX) design. He has written and presented on topics ranging from library marketing strategies, faculty outreach, information literacy outreach, library jargon, and library signage. His most recent book, Library Signage and Wayfinding Design: Communicating Effectively with Your Users, was published by ALA editions in November 2021. Polger holds a BA in Sociology from Concordia University, an MA in Sociology from the University of Waterloo, a B.Ed. in adult education from Brock University, and an MLIS from the University of Western Ontario. He is currently in his 7th year of study and working on his dissertation for his Ph.D. in Learning and Instruction in the Graduate Department of Education at the University at Buffalo, SUNY. Originally from Montreal, Canada, Polger moved to New York City in 2008.
