#### Collaborative organization in the "Triangle" of North Carolina

- Duke University
- North Carolina Central University
- North Carolina State University
- The University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill

**Purpose:** "To marshal the financial, human, and information resources of their research libraries through cooperative efforts in order to create a rich and unparalleled knowledge environment that furthers the universities' teaching, research, and service missions."

### The TRLN Cooperative Cataloging Pilot Charge

Examine the logistics, workflows, efficiency, cost and benefits of TRLN cooperative cataloging compared to vendor outsourcing

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  - > 100 Japanese titles sent by UNC to Duke
  - > 100 Arabic titles sent by Duke to UNC
- Set deadlines for deliverables and milestones
- Outline team members, their roles and their time commitment

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### **Cooperative Cataloging Agreement**

- Method for shipping books
- Standard of cataloging
- Procedures for tracking records and time
- Method for quality control
- Local procedures for importing records

### **Cataloging tasks**

- Time spent cataloging
- Type of cataloging: original, enhance copy, non-enhance copy
- Peripheral cataloging: NACO records and PCC-level enhancements

### **Cataloging Results**

UNC	43	56	5	35	3

- Importing records into local ILS

### Time, in Hours, Spent on Other Tasks





# Recommendations

#### **Benefits**

- Lower costs
- Higher quality of cataloging
- NACO and PCC records

#### Considerations

- Shipping out books
- Possible delays due to local needs
- Loss of a cataloger
- Unbalanced time spent cataloging

#### Very important

- Project charter
- Agreement that outlines cataloging procedures and workflows
- Best suited to projects with defined scope and deadlines, so that supervisor can prioritize the work
