PROJECT TEAM	Team members, roles & responsibilities.		
		DELIVERABLES	Please list the deliverables of this project. This includes tangible and intangible product or service that will be delivered.
PROJECT DESCRIPTION	Provide detailed description of this project. Please include relevant history, the impact, as well as the service to the patron or the business problem this project will solve.		
		STAKEHOLDERS	List individuals or groups who have an interest or need to be part of this project. This includes internal and external stakeholders.

Describe what this project	t does not entail. What tasks or questions are outside the boundaries of this project?	REPORTING	Describe the frequency and method of reporting on the status of this project.

Key Elements

CHANGE MANAGEMENT COMMUNICATION PLAN Describe what needs to be communicated both internally and externally. If training is needed, summarize how training will be set up and performed. Who TRAINING PLAN needs to be trained? What method? When? How often?
